Step-by-Step

Current Condition and Short Term Plans

1. Core Group
 - a. Listing - name, address, class, major
 - b. Desire and understanding
 - c. How long have they been acquainted
 - d. How were they selected
2. Recruitment and Education
 - a. Attract new members - assistance from Home Office of AGR - establish standards of quality and eligibility - men that are workers
 - b. Develop educational program for core group and new members - constructive and thorough
3. Recognition
 - a. By Fraternity - write a letter of application to the National Board of Directors for colony status - include signatures of undergraduates and alumni
 - b. By university - acceptance as a fraternity - understanding of timing and standards - potential development as a club to encourage acceptance - work with Dean of College of Agriculture
4. Organization
 - a. Constitution and By-laws
 - b. Officers
 - c. Meetings on weekly basis
 - d. Alumni organization - local and state alumni
 - e. Advisers
 - f. Committees
 - g. Financial structure/dues

5. Involvement, Support and Activities
 - a. Involvement in College of Agriculture
 - b. Support fraternities and attend activities
 - c. Obtain visibility
 - d. Don't bite off more than you can chew
 - e. Attend AGR Leadership Seminars and Conventions

Long Range Plans

1. Permanent organization and records
2. Written, detailed programs - recruitment, membership development, university and alumni relations, public relations, social, etc.
3. Housing - lease arrangement initially and eventual ownership - housing fund
4. Meals, annual function, positive awareness
5. Alumni incorporate in state
6. Attend Fraternity functions
